 - Judah's national salvation
 - Judah's salvation from the Babylonian captivity
 - The future salvation of the Jews when their kingdom is established
 - The personal salvation of the sinner who put his faith in the Redeemer

Isaiah

- Prophesied seven hundred years before Christ in a period of international tension
- Born into a powerful, aristocratic family
- His name means "The Lord saves."
- Son of Amoz is often thought of as the greatest of the writing prophets
- Served as a messenger of what God wanted the nations of Isaiah's day to know about divine purposes
